TODMORDEN AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

TODMORDEN is a market town and chapelry, in that portion of the parish of Rochdale which is in the hundred of Salford—207 miles n.w. by s. from London, 20 s. by e. from Manchester (rail), 12 w.s.w. from Halifax, 10 s.e. from Burnley, 11 n. from Rochdale (rail), and 61 s.w. from Leeds (rail). This town (anciently called *Todmaredene*) is situated in a picturesque and fertile district, called 'the vale of Todmorden,' or 'the Valley of the Fox Mers,' through which flows the river Calder, here separating the counties of Lancaster and York; and the junction of the chapelry of Todmorden and township of Walsden, in Lancashire, with the townships of Langfield and Stansfield, in the parish of Halifax, county of York. The manufactories for calicoes, fustians, dimities, satteens and velveteens, are numerous and extensive, and for the spinning of cotton, there are many large establishments—these several works employ water mills on the river, and steam engines of vast power. The conveyance of articles manufactured here to other markets is greatly facilitated by the Manchester and Leeds Railway, for which Todmorden is a principal station; as also upon the Rochdale canal, which skirts the town on the south, and communicates with other inland navigations. The town is lighted with gas, from the factory of Messrs. Fielden Brothers. Todmorden is included in the list of County Court towns, under the new act for the recovery of debts not exceeding £20.

About the year 1770 the present chapel of Saint Mary was erected on the site of a more ancient one; it is conveniently situated on an elevation near

the centre of the town. Some years since a new parsonage-house and sacristy were added, and another place of burial; the site of these additions were liberally bestowed by the late Mr. Samuel Greenwood, of this township, and the expense of the improvements aided by the church commissioners. In 1832 a new church was raised, on the north side of the town, by the parliamentary commissioners—it is an elegant structure in the Gothic style, and will accommodate a congregation of twelve hundred persons. The living of Todmorden is a perpetual curacy, to which the vicar of Rochdale presents. At Cross-stone, about a mile hence, another church has been built—from this situation a fine view of the valley is obtained. The township of WALSDEN, which contains a large population, has been constituted a separate district for ecclesiastical purposes, and an elegant church is being erected, from the design of Mr. Charles Child, of Halifax: the living will be in the gift of the Crown. There are chapels for various denominations of dissenters, of which a list is appended, with their respective ministers. To the places of worship generally Sunday schools are attached; and there are others upon the national plan—the building belonging to one of the latter schools is very handsome. The market days are Thursday and Saturday—fairs, the Thursday next before Easter, and September the 27th. In 1831 the chapelry of Todmorden contained 6,054 inhabitants, and in 1841, 7,311—at the present time (1847) it is estimated that the population of Todmorden, together with the townships of Walsden, Langfield and Stansfield, amounts to 18,000 persons.

ULVERSTONE AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

ULVERSTONE is a market town, township, parish,
 and port (or rather creek) of the port of Lancaster,
 in the hundred of Lonsdale, North of the Sands, in
 the deanery of Furness and Cartmel; 261 miles N.W.
 by N. (across the sands) from London, 22 N.W. from
 Lancaster, 14 s. from Hawkshead, 7 w. from Cartmel,
 and 5 N.E. from Dalton; it is 64 miles s. from Carlisle
 (Cumberland), 25 s.w. from Kendal (Westmoreland),
 and 41 s.w. from Appleby. It is situated upon the
 Leven, and is an ancient town, probably of Saxon origin
 —for, when the conquest by the Saxons was completed,
 and the country divided by the chiefs, each gave his
 name to the space of land assigned him; hence are
 derived the names of Ulverstone, from *Ulfra's town*,
 Dalton, &c. After the departure of the Romans, and
 the invasion of the Saxons, the Britons in Furness
 lived securely—relying upon the natural inaccessibility
 of their country, but at length shared the fate of the
 rest of the kingdom. Egfrid, king of the Northum-
 brians, gave Saint Cuthbert the land called Cart-
 mel, and all the Britons on it; and all Furness was
 divided into a number of small lordships, which were
 called after the names of their respective proprietors;
 some descendants of whom are still preserved, and in
 possession of these very estates. The town, which is

gas-lighted by a company, consists principally of four
 spacious streets, the houses forming which are chiefly
 well built of stone and whitewashed, which give them
 a clean and pleasing appearance, which is also improved
 by a clear rivulet of excellent water flowing through a
 part of the town. Ulverstone is a polling station at the
 election of members to represent North Lancashire;
 and it is included in the third list of County Court towns,
 under the new act (passed August 1846) for the re-
 covery of debts not exceeding £20. Petty sessions are
 held every Thursday, at the magistrates' office, in
 Theatre-street; as are also special sessions and the
 divisional meetings as occasion require. The principal
 public buildings, exclusive of those for divine wor-
 ship, are a spacious Union workhouse, a small theatre,
 and a savings' bank—the latter a neat building, sur-
 mounted by a fine tower containing a clock. There
 are three libraries—parochial, clerical, and subscription,
 and an assembly room. This place has long been
 noted for its flourishing manufactures of checks, canvass
 and hats. The principal exports are blue slate and
 iron ore, got in the neighbourhood, of which immense
 quantities are sent coast-wise; and large quantities of
 potatoes are raised from the land around here, which
 seems peculiarly adapted to the growth of this root.
